WHAT HAS YOUR FUND BEEN UP TO DURING LOCKDOWN?

- A full Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase of 3% was awarded to Pensioners with effect from 1 July 2020. A pro-rata increase was paid to Pensioners whose pensions commenced during the year 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020.
- The NJMPF announced its Going Green sustainable investing project during the March 2020 Annual information meeting. An important investment theme for pension funds currently is the choice trustees have on where to invest for a sustainable future. The Going Green campaign highlights the need for a cleaner planet and problems associated with climate change.
- In the mist of a global pandemic the NJMPF travelled to most of its municipalities distributing foot pump sanitizing stands, hand sanitizers and face masks to help municipalities fight the spread of the deadly corona virus.
